This is a badge scheme which will be linked to the Activities Mini-Sites. The badges include a variety of recognition topics for example: number of members, amount of money fundraised, and training modules that have been completed such as First Aid Training, Lincoln Together Training and Look After Your Mate Training. This will help students to keep a track of their achievements but also for prospective students to see which activities they want to join. Additionally, this will help our students to recognise how activities can make them more employable.

Objective 5 Complete a funding review of Activities by March 2020	Progress this month: Plans for next month:	Objective: Complete Over the past Academic Year we have been reviewing the Union's funding strategy with a focus on increasing participation in sport and helping to support as many clubs as possible. Due to Covid-19, we are experiencing financial trauma, we have done all we can do to protect student funding and maintain it at the same level as previous year. This year, we will be awarding a grant to clubs for the 2020/21 season. This has meant that we have been able to financially support all clubs that sent in an application based on the criteria in the policy. We are no longer Fully or Part-Funding any team, as a result, every team will be expected to fundraise in order to support their club which I will be supporting with.
