Training

Environment

As a result of these discussions, Cassie and I have attended numerous meetings with Estates regarding how Students can be involved in these changes to campus, operations within the University, and new sustainability policies that are being written. Additionally, we are now sitting on the Climate Emergency Oversight Group, and the Students' Union will be leading one of the working groups that feed into this. Furthermore, we're also working with the University to help them put on their "Climate Change and Sustainability Awareness Day" in November.
