Objective 1 Create an Academic Societies Program. Obviously with the pandemic we don't entirely know what our freshers week will look like however one thing for both postgraduate and undergraduate students that is certain is that they need to have the opportunity to properly acquaint themselves with the Lincoln community and city when they come to Lincoln to study. Progress this month: Plans for next month:	videos of the reps in the new academic year so that all students get the chance to 'meet' their rep/s and learn the faces of those who can help them and represent them to the university. I attended a webinar/conference that focused on how Sus have developed and prepared to represent students during the pandemic and how they have had to adapt to this new style of remote representation. This conference gave me a lot of ideas as to how reps can help bring some normalcy into these difficult and changed times to make sure students have frequent touch points between their unions, students and their academic teams. Having student reps communicate out academic policies and signposting supportive services works so well in terms of disseminating out information to a wider group of people, but also in reassuring students that there are still plenty of ways to support them even if their academic world seems to have been turned upside down. I want to make sure we make this support as clear and as easy to gain as possible and I think our rep network is one of the best ways to achieve this.
Objective 5 Enhancing learning spaces around campus.	Progress this month: Plans for next month:	Myself and Cassie meet with the university ICT services every month and this month I asked if it would be possible to use the learning lounges and around campus study spaces as more library-like spaces for students in the new academic year. The library, if government regulations stand on social distancing etc, will have to remain socially distanced and will probably look similar to how it did prior to the complete lockdown therefore more spaces will be required for students to study on campus. I approached the ICT services to see if the learning lounges could eb outfitted with more ICT equipment so they can function as more structured learning spaces and they will be looking into this further for me with an update other the summer when the university has more plans on how their buildings will look. This is just the start of how I want to continue on this work, I do not want this KPI to go 'unanswered' due to the pop-up labs cancellation so I will continue to work over the summer to find other ways to utilise the study spaces across the campus.
