BUCS Funding allocation

Finally this month, I faced one of my hardest challenges, allocating BUCS funding with the rest of the Participation Sub Committee. Firstly, teams sent in applications which went to the board and were scored against criteria to see how much funding they will receive, if any. This year is very different in terms of funding as we have a new pot of money: 'The BUCS Development Fund'. This is for teams who have not received BUCS funding but have the chance to be part funded (up to £3000 per club). This is by teams and the activities team setting KPI's and seeing how the club is progressing with their self-set aims, teams may receive part funding throughout the year if they are on track to achieve these targets and demonstrating that they are improving and making efforts to develop. I would like to congratulate everyone for their hard work this year in regards to BUCS and the involvement with the SU and other teams. We have allocated over £94,000 with 28 teams being fully funded, however this does not mean the others cannot be funded still. Congratulations everyone.
