Coursemate

Coursemate was released from the start of this academic year. Coursemate is an online ideas platform at a course level that works similar to SUGgestions. So far, there have been 41 submissions to Coursemate, 38 of which were approved. School reps have begun to work on issues in different areas, 3 of which have been completed, which is a particular strong start in the school of Engineering!

PG Week 2018

This year, Lincoln SU ran its second ever PG Week. The PG Week is designed to welcome and celebrate all of our Postgraduate Students at UoL. We have a range of events including a PG Fayre, Pub Quiz, Coffee Morning and Drinks Reception. At the PG Fayre there was over 350 attendees, a 500% increase on last year. Alongside this, the PG Pub quiz was a new addition to the week and was very well received. This is something that students have asked for again, so one will be scheduled later in the year! Alongside this, we have also successfully elected a Postgraduate Taught Officer, who is responsible for representing the academic interests of master's students. Nominations for the Research Officer is currently open!

Subject Level TEF.

This year the University of Lincoln has submitted to take part in pilot for the Subject Level Teaching Excellence and Outcomes Framework (TEF). At current, Lincoln has an Institutional Gold Rating. We have indicative ratings for 27 subjects. Subjects are made up of programmes and align to the NSS Subject Groups. The Subject Level TEF 2019 will act as an indicator for the live submission in 2020.

At Lincoln we have a great opportunity to work in partnership with the University, by including important feedback from students into the TEF submission documents for

all 27 categories. This will be done by your School Rep, or me where appropriate. Feedback will be taken on the following areas:

Student Engagement

- Contact time
- How challenging the course is
- How easy it is for students to commit to their studies (e.g. how stimulating the teaching is)

Valuing Teaching

- How much teachers are recognised or rewarded by the University
- How much you feel the University values teaching (e.g. over research)

Rigour & Stretch

- How much do you feel students are pushed to excel?
- Does the way the course is designed help this? If so how?
- Do the assessment types help this? If so how?
- Are students pushed to develop independence, gain skills and understanding

Feedback

- Does the feedback students get on their work and on assessments help them to develop?

Resources

- Are digital resources used to help students learn (including independently?)
- Are digital resources used to help students research?
- Are physical resources used to help students learn (including independently?)
- Are physical resources used to help students research?

Scholarship, Research & Professional Practice

- Are students involved in professional practice, research or scholarships? If so, how?
- Does this help to enrich the learning environment?

Personalised Learning

- Are students' learning experiences tailored to each student?
- Does this help students to progress and decrease the likelihood of students dropping out?

Employment & Further Study

- Are students able to achieve their education goals?
- Are students able to achieve their professional goals?
- Are students able to progress to further study?

Employability & Transferable Skills

- Have students been given the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills that employees value?

- Have students been given the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills that will enhance their personal lives?

Positive Outcomes for All

- Do all students have the opportunity to succeed at University, regardless of their background?
