President Report

Introduction

Firstly, happy New Year to all our students at Lincoln. I hope everyone had a lovely break over the festive period. Myself and the Executive Committee have hit the ground running at the start of this semester and year and below is a summary of the activities we have been undertaking.

Following on from the report last month, I highlighted that issues regarding PG students were raised by our PGR officer and myself and Tommy were looking to liaise with other SUs and assess how best we can help our cohorts. I have made contact with full-time PG representatives from other Students' Unions and have been able to establish good ground on how we can proceed with tackling issues raised. I will also be having meetings with members of the Vice-Chancellor's Office to ensure that these issues are discussed at a higher level. I have determined that it is important to firstly assess the context in which the SU is operating regarding PG issues as this has not been something that has been previously brought forward due to the lack of deeper PG representation.

Additionally, the Black History Month working group terms of reference have been drafted and a conversation is to be had with the Executive Committee to look at the direction that the working group will go in. It's important to ensure that there is a good integration with the Campaigns Network and ensuring that there is sufficient continuity with campaigns and initiatives.

I have been working to promote nominations and elections of positions in the Students' Union. Following on from the previous year where the turn-out was relatively high in comparison with previous years, the aim for this year is to ensure the student voice is empowered and that we have a high turnout but also higher numbers of nominations for candidates.

The second Student Leader Drop-In session was held this month. Here we explored the question "If you could change one thing about university, what would it be?". We were able to gather very useful information that ranged from course level problems right through to issues with the University Sports Centre. We also invested in buying hot food and drink (pizza, teas and coffees) that we gave to students who interacted with the pop-up. It was important to ensure that students were also aware of the initiatives being run by the Students' Union therefore we also promoted other things being done in the SU such as International Parties as well as

Swan's Den and Duke of Edinburgh. The information gathered from the drop-in has been compiled into a report which will then be taken to committees in the university such as the Education and Student Life Committee. Additionally, information will be relayed to individuals within the university to ensure that problems raised are appropriately highlighted to the relevant departments.

Sabbatical officers from York St. John Students' Union were invited on campus by myself and the Executive Committee. We partook in thematic discussions and planning of campaigns. We also took the opportunity to discuss areas of collaboration as well as future plans of both unions. Talks are underway to hopefully invite Bath Spa Students' Union sabbatical officers to Lincoln for a similar event.

This month also saw the departure of Deputy Vice Chancellor Professor Sue Rigby, who has moved on to Bath Spa University as the new Vice Chancellor. It has been an absolute pleasure to work with her over the past year and myself and the other sabbaticals would like to wish her the best in her new role.

SUggestions

Thus far this academic year, 88 SUggestions (at the time of writing) have been put forward by students. This past month I have been working to ensure that we are able to get a quick turnaround of SUggestions that pass the threshold of votes.

Current SUggestions assigned to myself include:

- **On-campus Lockers**
 - Progress has been slow to implement this SUggestion. However I will be reviewing this with the Executive Committee to look at the current provisions available in the university and liaise with the respective departments responsible for current provisions to ensure students are able to use lockers on campus
- **Bring back ID cards that have expiry dates on them!**
 - Research into the feasibility of Digital ID cards is being explored, this route will allow for the date on ID cards to be included but hopefully also incorporate a digitised approach that's easier and quicker for students
- **Stop giving out plastic straws at Tower Bar, The Swan and other university facilities**
 - Straws will no longer be automatically given out with a beverage in SU venues. Instead customers will have to actively request one. Straws available will be bio-degradable.
- **Add a search bar into the SU website.**
 - A search bar has been incorporated into the new website design which went live on the 22nd of January
