What has been worked on in the past month?

• Worked together with course reps to gather and provide feedback for the Subject Level TEF. All course reps went away and spoke to students and gathered some superb feedback which was really impressive with the small turn around we had to complete it all so very well done to all SocPol reps who helped. The report was then submitted to the VPE.

• One of my key aims this year is to increase the sense of community within the SocPol School. Just after the Rep Forum last month, I have worked with several course reps to create the Social and Political Sciences Academic Society, which will provide academic assistance, employability skills and more to the students in our School, and hopefully create the bridge between different courses and improve School integration.
